Malmsbury District Landcare Group, (MDLG), has been serving a broad area around Malmsbury for more than 20 years. It has members in the Macedon Ranges, Hepburn, and Mount Alexander Shires.

More than 50 households comprise the membership of the Group.

On-Ground Works

MDLG has been involved with many projects including weed control, re-establishing native vegetation, pest control, improving water quality, and improving habitat for native fauna. These projects have varied from work by members on their own properties, to large landscape-scale, long term projects on public land.

The Group has been awarded many monetary grants from various government agencies, and has also engaged in fund raising activities for the benefit of the environment and members.

Ongoing projects of note include, reclaiming the Channel Reserve in Malmsbury, restoration and development of the Malmsbury Common, weed control along Kangaroo Creek in the Wombat Forest, and weed removal and rehabilitation along the Coliban River at Lauriston.

Advice

If a member requires advice specific to their property, we can arrange for one or two of our more knowledgable members to come to visit, to help identify existing species and advise on possible planting, weed control, etc.

There are many experienced members willing to share advice on a wide range of topics including farming practises, fencing, etc.

Seedlings Available

Each year we collect seeds from local trees and plants and have them grown into seedlings by volunteers at Tree Project. These plants are available for our members at a low cost. We also use some specialist native plant nurseries on occasion.

Planting Days

We usually have two or three volunteer planting days each year which may be on public land or member's properties.

Walks

From time to time we have guided walks on members properties or wildflower walks on public land.

Working Bees

Members have the opportunity to help with some hands-on practical work on occasion, which can involve weed control, fencing etc.

Social

Members appreciate meeting other local people at the group's various activities. We hold two very popular social nights each year where members can enjoy good food and company in a relaxed atmosphere.

News

MDLG produces a bi-monthly newsletter, and distributes news by email from the regional network, local and State government agencies, and Landcare Victoria.

Equipment

Members can borrow equipment from MDLG. This includes three herbicide sprayers, tree-planting tools, and a rabbit warren smoker. These are available either for free, or a nominal charge.

Regional Network

MDLG is an active member of the Upper Campaspe Landcare Network, (UCLN), and our members have the opportunity to participate in events organised by the network, or any of the other 16 member groups. The UCLN organises educational events, Citizen Science Projects, threatened species surveys, landscape scale projects involving multiple Landcare Groups, publicises activities, and facilitates sharing of news and information between member groups.
